




An Australian Aboriginal interpretation of the constellation of Orion from the Yolngu people of Northern Australia.

The three stars of Orion's belt are three young men who went fishing in a canoe, and caught a forbidden king-fish, represented by the Orion Nebula.



6. Proper motion of Ursa Major stars




